Elder, it was to sign up for the Christchurch Basilica Choir and Orchestra's 'Europe 2010' tour. Our jet-setting musicians played Messiah: Friday in Palmerston North, Sunday in Christchurch, Tuesday in San Francisco, and then along with other choral music, in Tallinn (Estonia), Riga (Latvia), Kaunas and Vilnius (Lithuania), Frankfurt (Germany), Lisbon (Portugal), and Seville, Cordoba and Malaga (Spain). In the four weeks tour, the coach load of amateur musicians and supporters packed all the ingredients of a Maeve Binchy novel. A not so young Cyril who found love in the Frankfurt audience, the woman escaping an unhappy relationship, the hopeful widower, the university students always up for a laugh, the hypochondriac, the happy campers, two bassoonists, and so on.

The experience of playing in a wide range of old churches and cathedrals (the earliest built about 1220), in freezing conditions (-18°C daytime Tallinn), and trekking through the snow to concerts, was actually a lot of fun. We got to see places ordinary tourists never get to go, had a common interest among the band, and played great music in amazing buildings.


