# Top Violinist plays Beethoven Concerto with Sinfonia

Palmerston North has an opportunity to hear an exceptional concert this Saturday when leading New Zealand violinist Martin Riseley plays and conducts the Beethoven violin concerto with the Manawatu Sinfonia. Riseley is best known as a violinist, a former Guest Concertmaster of the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra who has performed with most leading New Zealand orchestras as well as several in Mexico, appearing on both national radio and television in both countries, and has also performed as soloist in Australia, Japan, and Great Britain.

But as he has already shown in rehearsal to be a very accomplished conductor who has impressed the Sinfonia with his musical insight and ability to obtain the very best from the musicians.

exceptional soloist!"

The Beethoven is one of the most popular violin concertos in the repertoire. "It's a great piece to share with audiences, and also wonderful for the orchestra to play - really a symphony with violin", says Riseley.

Beethoven is also special for the violinist. He has already played the cycles of violin sonatas and piano trios several times and as Concertmaster of the Edmonton Symphony played all of the symphonies, overtures and other large works. "Beethoven is a great composer because there are always things to learn and discover, as well as express in his works, with great intellectual depth. So, after years of playing his music I am still excited and challenged by it, particularly the Violin Concerto."

Riseley is both conducting and playing the violin concertos, so which does he prefer? "Too different to say! I enjoy both!" he says.

"It's perfectly feasible with the right repertoire, and encourages a kind of listening and musicianship that is both scary and empowering for an orchestra" he explains. "Hopefully the experience will be more exhilarating than anything for all involved and all performance should be risky. I've had very satisfying experiences as a soloist/conductor, and so far have never regretted doing it!"

The Sinfonia is also performing Schubert's 2<sup>nd</sup> Symphony, which in rehearsal has been electrifying.

"Schubert is such a wonderful composer, and this work, is really good for a chamber orchestra to play. It is a work that helps us understand the Classical language more clearly" says Riseley.

The Sinfonia was fortunate to sign Martin up soon after he arrived back in New Zealand, but already his concert diary is filling up fast. His next project is to play all the virtuosic Paganini Caprices at the Adam Chamber Music Festival this February in Nelson. "Just me and a whole lot of notes - no orchestra anywhere! That is far more scary than playing and conducting!" he laughs.
