

EXOTIC YOUTH ORCHESTRA AND SINFONIA COMBINED CONCERT NEXT WEEKEND!

The Sinfonia and Youth Orchestra give an exciting concert of exotic music on Saturday night. 19 September. The concert in the Salvation Army Centre follows the now well-established format of a first half provided by the Youth Orchestra, with the Sinfonia providing most of the second half, before the orchestras combine to provide a rousing send-off under the baton of John Schwabe.

Each part has its own highlights, featuring the orchestras' wind soloists in a concert underpinned by folk legends and exotic locales.

The Youth Orchestra performs Luigini's 'Ballet Egyptien' and Grieg's ever popular 'Norwegian Dance', along with the Entr'acte from Bizet's Spanish flavoured 'Carmen'.

The Sinfonia continues with Sibelius with the haunting 'Swan of Tuonela'. Sibelius portrays the Swan of death, of Finnish folk legend, with the cor-anglais, the husky and mournful sounding big brother of the oboe.

The French horns have a work-out in the opening of the delightful Donizetti **overture, 'Daughter of the Regiment'. The clarinets and oboes shine in Borodin's** Polovetsian Dances.

Finally, all the wind principals have their chance to shine with their quasi-cadenzas in a Rimsky-Korsakov favourite, the symphonic poem, 'Scheherazade'. Drawn from the '1001 Arabian Nights', 'Scheherazade' evokes an exotic Arabian theme.
