Next weekend the Sinfonia will be performing with Megan Molina. Megan began violin lessons from age four in Wellington. She graduated from Victoria University with a BM in Violin

A Few Words from the Leader of the MYO for 2015 - Sylvia Neild

This year I've had lots of opportunities with music, all of which have been challenging and fun.

Moving from the viola section to lead the first violins in the MYO was certainly interesting - leading a large section after being in a group of two took some getting used to. After the first concert I got the feel of being leader, and have both really enjoyed it and learned a lot.

I also really enjoyed travelling to Christchurch and Wellington to attend the NZ Secondary Schools Symphony Orchestra and the National Youth Orchestra, playing viola in both. The conductors of each were hugely inspiring in different ways, and had quite unique methods of conveying how they wanted the works played. It was great to play the Elgar Cello Concerto with Matthias Balzay, and the Ibert Flute Concerto with Bridget Douglas, and I particularly loved the NZ piece that we played with NYO by composer Salina Fisher. This used very innovative techniques such as the woodwind blowing through their instruments without their reeds, to create "gusts of wind".

I'm hoping to study performance music at university next year, and will be using all the skills that I've learnt from the three orchestras that I've been lucky enough to be part of. It's a long time and a lot of practicing hours since I first picked up a violin and made terrible scraping sounds, and I'm very grateful to all the people along the way - teachers and conductors - who gave me a chance and taught me to appreciate and play wonderful music.
